Objective:

Working closely with the Marketing Manager and Director of Public Affairs, the Senior Campaigns Officer will use their significant project management skills to design and deliver our UK, European and global advocacy campaigns across digital and offline channels, ensuring campaign objectives are met.

With a minimum two-year proven track record in a campaign's role, you will utilise your excellent creative copywriting, digital, data and relationship-building skills to acquire, convert and retain new and existing audiences to the organisation.

The Senior Campaigns Officer will also work closely with the Fundraising team to design and deliver the digital aspects of our donor retention and acquisition programme ensuring web, email and social media communications are optimised to drive donations and donor loyalty.

Key Responsibilities:

Objectives

1. Work with the Director of Public Affairs and Marketing Manager, as well as with colleagues from across the organisation, to deliver advocacy and income generating campaigns that our audience wants to engage with.
2. Contribute to the development of complex campaign strategies using your tactical campaigning knowledge to create campaign briefs, to copywrite, brief and design online campaign assets, in conjunction with third parties as required, that convert and retain new and existing audiences to the organisation.
3. Undertake end to end project management of campaigns, including the creation of project schedules, activity maps, and thorough risk assessments.
4. Use audience insight across digital and offline channels to inform advocacy and fundraising campaign strategies, and to ensure that communications are optimised, driving forward engagement to meet campaign objectives.
5. Investigate new ways of engaging new and existing audiences using creative thinking to utilise existing and new channels across digital and social media.
6. Lead on the content delivery for campaigns from concept to implementation using insight and research into target audiences to create engaging content that supporters want to interact with.
7. Write compelling copy that engages our target audiences across a range of mediums, including web copy, social media, and printed materials.

8. Brief the Marketing Officer on campaign deliverables, KPIs, and reporting requirements in line with campaign objectives, to ensure campaigns are delivered on time and to brief.
9. Regularly report on key campaign findings and results to key stakeholders within the organisation, using findings to inform and improve future campaign strategies.
10. Lead on the implementation of test and optimisation strategies across both integrated and digital campaigns to drive engagement from audiences in key territories.
11. Work closely with the Marketing Manager to develop marketing materials, including video, digital, and printed collateral to support campaign delivery.
12. Utilise the organisation’s CRM database to identify target audiences for campaigns, working with the Database Manager and Marketing Manager to ensure data integrity.
13. Assist the Marketing Manager to implement campaign and fundraising strategies, tools, and content marketing to increase campaign conversion, engagement, and retention, liaising with third party suppliers as required.
14. At the request of the Marketing Manager, or any other senior member of the team, undertake any other tasks consistent with the nature of this role.

Applicant Privacy Notice

What is the purpose of this document?

Cruelty Free International is a "data controller". This means that we are responsible for deciding how we hold and use personal information about you. You are being sent a copy of this privacy notice because you are applying for work with us (whether as an employee, worker or contractor). It makes you aware of how and why your personal data will be used, namely for

the purposes of the recruitment exercise, and how long it will usually be retained for. It provides you with certain information that must be provided under the General Data Protection Regulation ((EU) 2016/679) (GDPR).

Data protection principles

We will comply with data protection law and principles, which means that your data will be:

- Used lawfully, fairly and in a transparent way.
- Collected only for valid purposes that we have clearly explained to you and not used in any way that is incompatible with those purposes.
- Relevant to the purposes we have told you about and limited only to those purposes.
- Accurate and kept up to date.
- Kept only as long as necessary for the purposes we have told you about.
- Kept securely.

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The kind of information we hold about you

In connection with your application for work with us, we will collect, store, and use the following categories of personal information about you:

- The information you have provided to us in your curriculum vitae and covering letter.
- The information you have provided on our application form, including name, title, address, telephone number, personal email address, date of birth, employment history, qualifications.
- Any information you provide to us during an interview.

We may also collect, store and use the following types of more sensitive personal information:

- Information about your health, including any medical condition, health and sickness records.

How is your personal information collected?

We collect personal information about candidates from the following sources:

- You, the candidate.
- Any recruitment agency, from which we collect the following categories of data.
- Your named referees, from whom we collect the following categories of data.

How we will use information about you

We will use the personal information we collect about you to:

- Assess your skills, qualifications, and suitability for the role.
- Carry out background and reference checks, where applicable.
- Communicate with you about the recruitment process.
- Keep records related to our hiring processes.
- Comply with legal or regulatory requirements.

It is in our legitimate interests to decide whether to appoint you to the role since it would be beneficial to our business to appoint someone to that role.

We also need to process your personal information to decide whether to enter into a contract with you.

Having received your CV and covering letter **OR** your application form, we will then process that information to decide whether you meet the basic requirements to be shortlisted for the role. If you do, we will decide whether your application is strong enough to invite you for an interview. If we decide to call you for an interview, we will use the information you provide to us at the interview to decide whether to offer you the role. If we decide to offer you the role, we will then take up references before confirming your appointment.

If you fail to provide personal information

If you fail to provide information when requested, which is necessary for us to consider your application (such as evidence of qualifications or work history), we will not be able to process your application successfully. For example, if we require a credit check or references for this role and you fail to provide us with relevant details, we will not be able to take your application further.

How we use particularly sensitive personal information

We will use your particularly sensitive personal information in the following ways:

- We will use information about your disability status to consider whether we need to provide appropriate adjustments during the recruitment process, for example whether adjustments need to be made during an interview.
- We will use information about your race or national or ethnic origin, religious, philosophical or moral beliefs, or your sexual life or sexual orientation, to ensure meaningful equal opportunity monitoring and reporting.

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Information about criminal convictions

We do not envisage that we will process information about criminal convictions.

Automated decision-making

You will not be subject to decisions that will have a significant impact on you based solely on automated decision-making.

Data sharing

Data security

We have put in place appropriate security measures to prevent your personal information from being accidentally lost, used or accessed in an unauthorised way, altered or disclosed. In addition, we limit access to your personal information to those employees, agents, contractors and other third parties who have a business need-to-know. They will only process your personal information on our instructions and they are subject to a duty of confidentiality. Details of these measures may be obtained on request.

We have put in place procedures to deal with any suspected data security breach and will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected breach where we are legally required to do so.

Data retention

How long will you use my information for?

We will retain your personal information for a period of six months after we have communicated to you our decision about whether to appoint you to the role. We retain your personal information for that period so that we can show, in the event of a legal claim, that we have not discriminated against candidates on prohibited grounds and that we have conducted the recruitment exercise in a fair and transparent way. After this period, we will securely destroy your personal information in accordance with applicable laws and regulations.

If we wish to retain your personal information on file, on the basis that a further opportunity may arise in future and we may wish to consider you for that, we will write to you separately, seeking your explicit consent to retain your personal information for a fixed period on that basis.

Rights of access, correction, erasure, and restriction

Your rights in connection with personal information

Under certain circumstances, by law you have the right to:

- **Request access** to your personal information (commonly known as a "data subject access request"). This enables you to receive a copy of the personal information we hold about you and to check that we are lawfully processing it.
- **Request correction** of the personal information that we hold about you. This enables you to have any incomplete or inaccurate information we hold about you corrected.
- **Request erasure** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to delete or remove personal information where there is no good reason for us continuing to process it. You also have the right to ask us to delete or remove your personal information where you have exercised your right to object to processing (see below).
- **Object to processing** of your personal information where we are relying on a legitimate interest (or those of a third party) and there is something about your particular situation which makes you want to object to processing on this ground. You also have the right to object where we are processing your personal information for direct marketing purposes.

- **Request the restriction of processing** of your personal information. This enables you to ask us to suspend the processing of personal information about you, for example if you want us to establish its accuracy or the reason for processing it.
- **Request the transfer** of your personal information to another party.

If you want to review, verify, correct, or request erasure of your personal information, object to the processing of your personal data, or request that we transfer a copy of your personal information to another party, please contact the Deputy Chief Executive in writing.
